

Credit Options for Dual Enrollment Eligible AP Courses

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Option 1: Taking the AP Exam



- Students take an AP course to prepare for the AP exam (must register and pay to take the exam) in May and can potentially earn college credits (dependent on each college).
- By choosing Option 1, you are deciding to take the course and the AP test. This option also allows you to be exempt from taking the final exam.





Option 2: Earning College Credit



- Students can choose to take an AP course that is also Dual Enrollment eligible. They need to complete paperwork, pay a fee and earn a C as the final course grade. [Please click here for a full list of courses.](#)
- By choosing Option 2, you are deciding to take the course for dual-enrollment college credit, which can be transferable to other Universities.

Option 3: Both AP Exam *and* Dual Enrollment



- Students can choose to take the AP Exam *and* participate in the dual- enrollment program.
- While there are additional costs for this option, it does allow for two potential paths to earning college credit: a 4 or 5 on the AP Exam OR earning a final course grade of C.
