



ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT NOTICE

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) 40 CFR, Part 763, Subparts C, E, and M, and on behalf of the East Brunswick Board of Education, the Facilities Management Department recently completed an annual inspection of district facilities. Part of this inspection includes notifying parents, faculty, and staff of pertinent changes regarding the status and/or condition of asbestos containing materials throughout the district. Interested parties can find these inspection reports on file at each individual school, and district-wide information has been consolidated and stored at the District's Support Operations Facility.

To remain in compliance with the AHERA laws, as well as ensuring the safety of students, faculty, and staff; asbestos containing materials previously identified in each facility, are part of a rigorous operations and maintenance program. During the 2017-18 school year, licensed asbestos contractors removed and disposed of hazardous materials from the following locations: East Brunswick High School, as well as Chittick and Irwin Elementary Schools. Additionally, as part of the abatement process, air sampling tests and visual inspections were conducted to ensure no asbestos particles remained in the air.

Currently, there are no additional changes, updates or modifications that have occurred to asbestos containing materials identified in the district's comprehensive Asbestos Management Plan (AMP). Complete reports for each removal project will be reflected in the next periodic update of the AMP, currently slated to occur during the winter of 2018.
