Anthony Yoseloff



Anthony A. Yoseloff (Tony) is a graduate of East Brunswick High School, Class of 1992. He is the Executive Managing Member of Davidson Kempner Capital Management, an alternative asset management firm based in New York with approximately \$33 billion in assets under management. Mr. Yoseloff joined the Firm in 1999. During his tenure at the firm, assets under management have grown from \$1 billion to its current size. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of Princeton University, The New York Public Library and Leadership Enterprise for a Diverse America. He also serves on the investment committee of The New York Public Library and is a member of the Board of Directors of PRINCO, the investment manager of the Princeton University endowment.

Tony was an early backer and long-time board member of DonorsChoose.org, which donates \$150 million a year to teacher proposals at public schools across the United States. Tony was on the Board until 2017 but dropped off once he picked up the Princeton responsibilities. He continues to be actively involved as a member on their National Advisory Council. Since 2003, Tony has been a significant supporter of the East Brunswick Education Foundation, which was co-founded by his mother, Darlene Yoseloff. Tony's work with DonorsChoose.org was inspired by EBEB, as he wanted all public schools (regardless of income levels) to have access to the same type of support that EBEB provides.

Tony received a J.D. from Columbia Law School and an M.B.A. from the Columbia Graduate School of Business Administration in 1999. He earned an A.B., cum laude, from the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University in 1996.

Tony grew up in East Brunswick and attended East Brunswick schools from K-12, including Warnsdorfer, Hammarskjold, Churchill and East Brunswick High School. He currently lives in New York City with his wife Nanar, an attorney and writer, and their three children.
