

College Pathways Program

Two Pathways to Earn College Credit MC Dual Enrollment and High School Scholar Program

Pathway 1: Dual Enrollment

The <u>Dual Enrollment</u> Program is for students to earn college credit for High School courses that they take at East Brunswick High School. Students <u>earn</u> <u>both college and High School credit</u> for these courses.

Overview:

- Students must be enrolled in an eligible course.
- There is no limit on the number of credits a student can take.
- Cost is \$135 per course.
- Students must have a "C" or better in course for credit.

Pathway 2: High School Scholar Program

The <u>High School Scholars</u> Program is for students to earn college credit for a course in which they meet the prerequisite.

Students <u>cannot earn High School credit</u> for a course taken through this pathway.

Overview:

- Students must be 15 years of age or older.
- Cost is \$135 per course.
- Application is Required.
